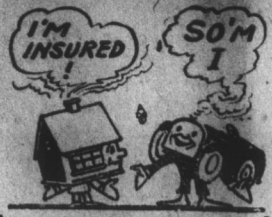

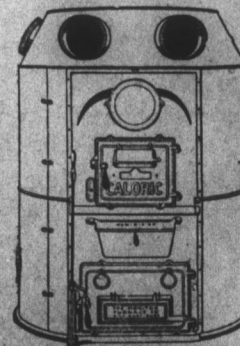

LOCAL MENTION

All the offices in the County Building will be closed Thanksgiving Day.

One case of scarlet fever was reported today at the county health office.

Watt Barringer was lightly injured this morning when a bale of cotton at the cotton platform fell on him.

Rev. L. A. Thomas will conduct the Thanksgiving service at the Jackson Training School tomorrow morning.

There will be no issue of The Tribune tomorrow as our force will join the world in observance of Thanksgiving Day.

The Parks-Belk Co. will take up all sugar tickets between now and January 1st. After that time they will be void. Sugar at 5 cents a pound with tickets.

The post office will be closed tomorrow except that the general delivery window will be open from 8:30 a. m. to 10:30 a. m. There will be no city or rural deliveries.

All offices in the court house will be closed tomorrow, it was stated this morning. With the exception of the police department, all offices in the city hall will be closed also.

No meeting of the Concord Kiwanis Club will be held this week. Due to the fact that a number of members plan to be out of the city it has been decided to call off the meeting this week.

Carl Patterson, of Landis, who was hurt in an auto accident here several days ago, returned to his home during the day. He was taken to the Concord Hospital here immediately after the accident in which he suffered lacerations and bruises.

Public schools of the city closed this afternoon for the remainder of the week for Thanksgiving. Many out-of-town teachers are expecting to leave this afternoon for their homes to spend the holidays with relatives. Work will be resumed in the schools Monday.

Thanksgiving service will be held in St. James Lutheran Church tomorrow morning at 8:30. For a number of years this service has been largely attended and a large congregation is anticipated tomorrow. The offering will be made for the orphan's home.

There will be a Thanksgiving service at St. Johns Lutheran Church Thursday evening at 8:30. The address will be made by Rev. M. L. Ridenhour, of Kannapolis. Let the congregation and friends come together and render thanks for the many blessings during the past year.

Some of the fans will go to Charlottesville to see Carolina and Virginia; others will go to Durham to see Davidson and Duke; others will go to Raleigh to see State and Wake Forest and still others will go to Charlotte to see Roanoke and Lenoir-Rhyne.

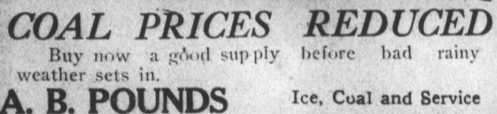
