Edgar Hazelton, the lawyer, disclosed his intention while questioning a talesman at the trial's opening session.

"Do you know," he shouted suddenly after several minor questions, "that a defendant cannot be found guilty if it be shown that she acted under the command of another, one of whom she stands in fear of her life, or of great bodily harm?" "That is the law."
