Output of Electrical Power Increases.

Raleigh, May 30.—Output of electrical power continued through the year at the same rate of increase experienced during the first quarter will result in the greatest output in the history of North Carolina, according to Charles E. Ray. Jr., assistant engineer of the Department of Conservation and Development.

The report recently issued by the United States Geological Survey for the first three mouths of 1927 show the largest output of public utility power over the corresponding quarter for any previous year.

Total production of power by public utility plants alone the year follows: January, 114,461,000 kilowatt hours. February, 122,358,000; and March '94-383,000 making a total of 336,182-000 kilowatt hours.
