Major S. F. Telfair Dead.
Raleigh, June 17.—Funeral services were conducted here this afternoon for Major Samuel Fowle Telfair, 64, one time active in State politics, whose death occurred yesterday.
Major Telfair was private secretary to three governors of North Carolina, serving from 1889 to 1898 under Fowle, Holt and Carr. He was a graduate of Davidson College. For the last several years he had been prominently engaged in business affairs.

A. J. Draper Withdraws From Race
For Republican National Committeemanship.
Charlotte, June 17.—W. G. Braniham, of Durham, appears to hive a clear field for the office of Republican national committeeman, says the Charlotte News in a story appearing today. A. J. Draper, Charlotte capitalist, has withdrawn from the race that starred with the appointment Johnson J. Hayes as judge of the middle district federal court.

The News says a telegram has been received by Meckienburg country Republicans from Mr. Draper aunouncing that he would not be a candidate for the place.
