MILLER IS REPORTED CAUGHT IN CATAWHA

Report Also Said He Was About To Be Lynched—Reports Run Down But Prove Groundless. Morganton, June 23.—Shortly after 8 o'clock tonight a large crowd of Hickory citizens arrived here saying a riot call had been sounded in that city with the accompanying information that Broadus Miller, alleged slayer of Gladys Kincaid, had been captured and was about to be lynched. Major Ed. Jones, of the state national guard in Asheville, arrived here late today and after conferring with local officers, decided to call troop G, 109th North Carolina cavalry, stationed in Hickory. A telephone call was sent to Hickory ordering the troops as a precautionary measure. Indications were given by military officers tonight that both the Morganton and Hickory troops would be held in readiness throughout the night. No major clues have come to light here since the report that the negro had been at Hokes store, eight miles southwest of Morganton. Numerous rumors, all of which lacked authenticity, were run to earth and proved groundless.
