Mr. Allen has returned to the states to live and will reside in Durham, N. C., where his father is located. "That was a great experience and I'll write something for you about the Pan-American highway," he told a Post reporter.

Mr. Allen spent the past year and a half down there working and he said that one of the things he enjoyed most was The Skyland Post.

"I got it regularly and believe me I enjoyed reading it," he said. "In fact all of the boys in our section read the paper because it was about the only paper our gang received and there you get very little outside world news."

In connection with the paper, he said that he had read The Post at an altitude of 11,400 feet. "I bet there is not another subscriber who has read the paper at such an altitude," he declared.

"Yes, of course, it was very cold up there and the air was extremely light."
