

ty superior court for the trial of criminal cases, which opened on Monday morning with Judge Felix Alley presiding, was centered around the case of Dewitt Francis and his son, Ira, being tried in connection with the death of Dent Baldwin.

The case went to the jury shortly after 4:00 o'clock yesterday afternoon and a verdict is expected to be brought in this morn-

Baldwin met his death in December, 1943, as a result of a blow on the head following an altercation with Mr. Francis and his son over tobacco, which they were getting ready to market.

The case was previously tried before Judge Hoyle Sink, when a mistrial was declared. Appearing for the defense this


