

Plans are now being completed for the fifth annual feeder calf sale to be held at the West Jefferson livestock market Tuesday, September 23, opening at 1:00 o'clock, H. D. Quessenberry county agent announced.

Calves will be offered from four counties, Ashe, Alleghany, Avery and Watauga. The sale which is being sponsored by the State Department of Agriculture. Extension Division and the West Jefferson livestock market is expected to attract a large crowd.

It was announced that calves should be brought in as early in the morning as possible so that they can be graded before the sale. Beef specialists from the N. C. Department of Agriculture will assist in the grading, it was ex-

Calves will be offered weighing from 300 to 650 pounds and are to be divided into pens according to their weights.
