#### Announce Chest X-ray Clinic To Be Held Oct. 15

Will Be Conducted At Office Of Health Department In Ashe County Hospital

It was announced this week by Dr. Robert King, of the District Herlth Department, that a chest X ray can't would be neld at the chice of the county health deprotection the Ashe he-pital, next Wednesday, October 15. At this time Harold Satterwhite, Xray technician for the N. C. Sanitorium, will bring a portable Xray machine to be used.

It was pointed out by Dr. King that this clinic would be available to the public at a cost of one dollaw per person. An effort is being made to contact persons, who have a positive skin test for tuberculosis, who had had tuberculosis in the past or have been associated with it. It is neped that they will avail themselves of the benefit of the clinic.

Work is now going forward on the foundation for an observation tower to be built on the top of Negro Mountain, by the U. S. Forestry Service.


A road is also being built from the rock on up to the top of the mountain to the tower base, where a bulldozer has been in operation for the past few days.

# **Connection With Shooting Of Wife**

Hearing Of A. F. Brown Of Laurel Springs Is Set For Next Wednesday

Alex F. Brown, Laurel Springs man is being held in the Ashe county jail, pending a hearing scheduled for next Wednesday. in connection with the fatal shooting of his wife, Judy Reeves Brown, which is believed to have taken place last Friday, at their nome between Nathan's Creek and Laurel Springs.

Mrs. Brown was found dead in the kitchen of their farm home by the officers and coroner R. R. Badger, called to investigate on Saturday morning, at the request of Lon Reeves, a brother of the deceased.

She had been dead for some ime officers reported, and investigation proved that she had een shot in the head as well as

According to reports, the young on of the deceased, Charles Brown, 8, returned home late Friday and found his mother dead and upon questioning his father about it, he was immediately ordered to bed. He arose early the next morning, however, and went o the home of relatives telling what had happened.
