County Board Sends Proposal To State Office

At a special meeting of the Ashe county board of education on Monday, tentative plans for county's use of the state and will be sent to the State De-

in favor of this, the minutes of members said they were glad to approve this as a county, not a community project.

Other plans which tentative allotments by the board included school projects at Helton, Glendale Springs, White Oak and Fleetwood. Other projects of varying costs were approved by the board for Jefferson, Virginia - Carolina, Healing Sp'gs, Elkland, Riverview, Lansing and Nathan's Creek.

It was explained that projects in several of these schools deal with sanitation and have already been approved, such as those at Jefferson, Healing Springs and Nathan's Creek.

Records of the board meeting show that West Jefferson, which s one of the worst crowded schools in the county, did not ask for funds. It was explained that this school was willing to give up any consideration whis time provided that a central high school could be built.
