County-Wide Survey Now Being Made Through County Agent's Office

More than 1,500 requests for rural telephones have been return to the county agent's office following the 3200 inquiries sent out a short time ago, it was announced vesterday.

Dana Tugman, county agent, said that replies were still coming in and that his office expected to have more than 2500 before the survey is closed.

In each community of the county a committee of three has been named to help carry out the survey to determine the demand for rural telephone service.

The survey is the result of a county-wide meeting held at the courthouse recently to discuss the possibilities of badly needed rural telephone service throughout this
