Napoleon's Femily Quarrel Over the Sale of Louisiana.

When Monroe arrived on April 2th, Livingstone had an amazing proposition to set before him. Bonaparte wanted to sell Louisiana. Whatever opposition Bonaparte's ministers had made he had silenced, the Chambers he had not even consulted. The only serious hinderrance he seems to have encountered, was in his own family, with his brothers Lucien and Joseph. Lucien had secured Louisiana for France in 1800, by the treaty of San Ildefonso; and was proud of his work. He had won rank as a diplomat from the affair, as well as an enormous fortune; and when Joseph came to him, telling him the General was going to sell the recent acquisition, he was angry. The two brothers hurried to Bona-

parte to remonstrate. They found him in his bath; but, in the fashion of the day, he received them, and at once introduced the subject.

"Has Joseph told you I am going to sell Louisiana?" he asked of

"Yes," answered Lucien; "but I flatter myself that the Chambers will not give their consent."

"So do I, as I have told you," put in Joseph.

This opposition fired Bonaparte, who promptiv assured them that, if he wished, he would sell Louisiana without the consent of any one whomsoever.






