SPAIN COMES TO OUR TERMS. AGSBES TO Lat thy pait PINE ISLANDS GO.
While Conceding American, De mands in the Interest of Peace,
Spanish Commissioners. Insist That Their dause is Just.
Paris, Nov. 28.-The Spanish peace commissioners delivered to the American commissioners at today's joint session of the peace commissio the acceptance by spain of the term of the United States. This accep tance was accompanied by a memo randum setting forth that Spain yielded only to superior force. The sitting was ucjourned until Wednesday.

These have been steadily rejected by the American commissioners, and a prompt answer made the coudition of continuation of nethe couditi
gotiations.
"Recognizing the impossibility of further revisting their powerfu antagonist, and so save greater loss and hart to Spain, the commissioners, acting upon the advice and instructions of the Madrid government now feel that no other course is open to them but to accept the victor' terms however harsh, and to proceed to their accentance as embodied in the last proposition relative to the Pbilippines, in order to have peace and to not break the Washington

The foregoing statement is appro ed by the American delegates.
