## BOERS IN NEW CASTLE.

### THERE HAS BEEN NO BATTLE WITH WHITES' FORCES.

**Boers Repulsed With Loss—How The Armored Train Was Destroyed—Buller Will Have 70,000 Men Against 40,000 Boers.**

LONDON, Oct. 14.—The Transvaal war now absorbs popular attention, and upon the question all Britons are patriotic. There will be no break in support offered government when Parliament meets Tuesday, unless possibly a handful of Irish members seize the opportunity to proclaim their hatred of British institutions. The opposition may criticize the government for unpreparedness; and this would be fully justified, for it is becoming more evident daily that British forces will not be prepared for a great advance before Christmas. The Army corps which is expected to march in one great column to Pretoria will not embark until October the 20.

Those who make light of the threatened delay assume that Boer aggression in the meantime will be of little consequence and confined to Natal and the vicinity of the western frontier. The assumption is stupid. There is no possible doubt, in view of the Boer's ultimatum, that it is their intention to carry on the most aggressive campaign possible.

It is strongly probable that the British acquisition of Delagoa Bay will be officially announced on the assembling of Parliament. Boer authorities expect this. No hint of the terms has transpired, but it is believed that the Portuguese authorities will endeavor to quiet strong popular prejudice in the country against the deal by taking an attitude of yielding to superior force. It is safe to say that the price of German acquiescence is a substantial one.

If Delagoa Bay becomes British property, then, according to some opinion, the chief British force would land there and march by the shortest route to Pretoria. The correspondent who sailed with General Buller today to accompany him throughout the campaign, is inclined to the opinion that the force will march straight north to the nearest railroad base on the southern boundary of the Orange Free State, to Bloemfontein and then to Johannesburg and Pretoria. General Buller is quoted as saying that he expects to reach the latter city about the middle of February.

It was generally assumed by military men, until the past few days, that two forces of about equal strength would invade the Transvaal from Natal and Kimberley, converging toward Pretoria and Johannesburg. If Buller lands at Cape Town the plan will be a single great invasion from the south through Orange Free State to Pretoria. If he goes to Durban it will indicate two converging columns from Natal to Kimberley, while if he goes to Delagoa Bay then it will be clear that the British will try to make the shortest land march to the Boer capital.

Estimates of the length of the war even by military men who know South Africa and the Boer character vary widely. Some profess to believe the fighting will be over by Christmas. Others say June, but a majority fix February for the cessation of hostilities.

## Opposition to Paper Trust.

KNOXVILLE, Oct. 17.—Boston and New York capitalist have secured a site at Bristol, Va., for a large pulp mill and paper factory, and will organize a company with a capital of \$500,000. It will be a branch of Columbian Paper Company and will operate, it is said, in opposition to the paper trust. A similar plant will be established by the same company at Buena Vista, Va., where about the same amount will be invested.

## Outlook In Ohio.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 16.—"Republicans will carry Ohio from 40,000 to 50,000 majority," said Representative Brownwell, of Cincinnati, today.
