A FLOWER PARADE.

TO BE ANOTHER BRILLIANT FEATURE OF FAIR WEEK.

Ladies of the City Now at Work on Details—Determined to Make the Flower Parade a Tremendous Success.

In some of the largest cities in recent years there have been given parades in which the ingenuity of construction beautiful and tasty effects in the way of floral decoration has been manifested by the ladies who have usually had the work in charge. It is the purpose of the management of the Lynchburg Fair and Carnival to have as one of its attractions such a pageant, and the ladies of the city are now at work in getting the details of the scheme in proper shape. Accounts and illustrations of such processions have frequently contributed much to render attractive the pages of the leading magazines of the country, and those who have witnessed such spectacles are loud in their praise. It is the purpose of the management having the parade in charge to secure every available equipage in the city, and have their owners decorate the same with flowers, artificial or natural and enter the parade, which will be on the first day of the Fair, October 15th.

LADIES IN CHARGE.

The ladies who have the matter in charge are Mrs. F. Charles D. Witt, Mrs. W. P. Clark, Mrs. George D. Witt, Mrs. Charles M. Guggenheimer, Mrs. Minor Davis, Mrs. Aperson, Mrs. John H. Lewis, Mrs. James Scott, Mrs. W. C. N. Randolph, Mrs. James D. Tate, Mrs. Peter Ainslie, Mrs. N. D. Eller, Mrs. Randolph Carrington, Mrs. B. B. Adams, Mrs. C. E. Manner, and Mrs. Pelham Moorman.

The Fair committee will furnish each equipage with one hundred flowers, and as many more can be obtained by those desiring them as may be needed at the cost of one dollar per hundred. These flowers will in most cases have to be made, and it is desirable for those wishing them to place their orders as early as possible with one of the above ladies, who will see that they are supplied. The management of the Fair and Carnival have decided to give prizes for the best turnout in the parade; To the first \$75.00 to second \$50.00 and to the third \$25.00.

The ladies interested in the movement held a meeting yesterday morning and decided to make a personal canvass of the city to secure all the private equipage that would be found available. To accomplish this the city was divided up in districts and one of the ladies assigned to canvass each district the assignment are as follows: To West Lynchburg, Mrs. C. E. Heald; Diamond Mrs. John H. Lewis, and Mrs. C. M. Guggenheimer; lower end of Main street and White Rock Hill, Mrs. Pelham Moorman; Garland Hill, Mrs. W. P. Clark; College Hill, W. C. N. Randolph; Clay street, Mrs. George D. Witt; Fifth street and part of Garland Hill Mr. Minor Davis; Rivermont, Mrs. N. D. Eller; Federal Hill, Mrs. Randolph Carrington; Daniel's Hill Mrs. B. B. Adams.

It is desired to invite all who have private carriages to join in this parade in order to make it a tremendous success. If in the canvass any one should be overlooked by the ladies having the several districts in charge, those who are not seen are invited and expected to advise any one of the canvassers of their willingness to participate, and the details will be explained.

It is the intention of the Program Committee to have this attraction for the first day of the Fair, which will be the Tournament Day, and the procession will be headed by the

tournament riders and accompanied by the several bands of music that will be present during the week.

It is predicted that the Flower Parade will be a splendid spectacle, and a glance at the personnel of its lady managers will at once demonstrate the reason for this prediction.—Lynchburg News.
