ALANTA SUNDAY JOURNAL.

Another Piece of Superb Enterprise on the Part of the Great Atlanta Daily—Will Appear June 1.

The Atlanta Journal has announced its purpose to begin on June 1 the publication of a Sunday morning edition. This announcement carries with it the assurance that the Sunday Journal will be one of the most complete, comprehensive and attractive papers published in the entire country—for it is well known that whatever this great southern newspaper undertakes it executes perfectly.

The Journal argues that the publication of its Sunday edition is made necessary by the growing demand for The Journal on seven days of the week instead of six—in other words a demand for a newspaper that gives all the news of the time.

The Journal has gone about the preparation of its Sunday edition with the same spirit of enterprise and liberality of expenditure that has made The Daily Journal the most popular and universally read newspaper in the south. 
