THE BILL TO REGULATE LT,

A bill to be entitled "An Act to Regulate the Manufacture and Sale of Liquors in North Caran lina" was introduced by
Watt. of Iredell, as follows:
That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporaion to manufacture, sell or otherwise dispose of for gain, any spiritous, vinous or mault liquors or inoxicating bitters within the State forth Carolina except in incororated cities and towns wherein he sale or manufacture of libuor is nctior may not hereafter be prohibited by law, Provided, this act hall not be construed to ferbid the ale of such spirituous, vinous o nale liquors by druggists for sicknesshmpon the written prescription of a regular practicing physidan aviro such sict persons under hi charge. provided, further, that this act-shall not ue so consturd as to apply to wine or cider manufactured from grapes, berries or fruits aised on the lands of the person o manufacturing, or purohased by the manufacturet rower thereo
Section 2 That it shall be unlaw ful for any person, persons, firm or coporation to manufacture any spiritous, vinous or malt li quors or intoxicating bitters except as herein before irovided in an incorporated obtaininy, as provided by law, license therefor both from th board of commissioners of the coun ty in which said city or town is situated and from the board of al dermen or city counchmen. or th name called of said city or town Section 3. That any person vi lating the provisions of this a with reference to the sale, or dis position for gain, of spiritous, vin ous or malt fiquors or intoxicath Vitters shall be guilty of a misde nueanot and upon conviction shall
be imprisoned not exceeding six monthis or fined not exceeding $\$ 200$ or both

Section 4. That any persol vio latng the provisionsiof this act with spirituous vinous of maft liquors or intoxicating bitters, shall be guity or a than four months or morc than than four months or more than
two years or fined not less than $\$ 200$, not more than $\$ 1,000$ or both in the decretion of the corrt. Section 5. That any phypician
who shall make any prescription except in case of sickness for the arpose o bona fide under bis charge to pur chase auy intoxicating liquer contrary any the provision of this ct and any druggist who shall du plicate the prescription of a physi cian for intoxicating liquor for any person or persons, not bopa fil under his charge, without the writ ten direction of the physician wh gave the same, shall be gaility of a misdemeanor and upon conviction
shall be fined or imprisosed fo each and every Jffense or both the discretion of the eourt An
all drugg st selling intoxicating liquors by preccription as forsaid

Setion 6, That all laws and clauses of law in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.
