## NEGROES TO THE PHILIPPINES

Department Issues Orders for prepa ration for service and Soldiers Will Sail Between March the 5 and Jume

## 2. of Present Year:

Washington Jan. 5. - The Ninth and tenth cavalry and the Twentyfith Infantry, including all the nero soldiers in the regular army in his country, have been ordered to repare for service in the Philipines and will sail at different times be ween March 5 th and June 5 th o this year. The only other regimen composed of negros, the Twenty 6th Infantry, is now doing service in the Philippines
Other troops ordered to the Phil ppines are the sixth cavalry, the Eighteenth, Twenty sixth, Twenty inth and Thirtieth Infantry. The roops which will be relieved by he sending of these new regiments will be the Fourth, Seventh anc Eighth Cavalry and the Ninth Thirteenth, Fifteenth, Sixteenth. and Nineteenth Infantry.
It is stated by Major Genera Bell, ctief of staff, tha the negro tegiments are being sent is the Philippines because it is their turn 0 go and not because of any desir to get them out of the United States at this time.
The negro troops are to sail for he Philippines before most of the white organizations, the last of which will not leave this countr until early in January, 1908

ourt Tuggests a Settlement of tl Suit th Have Dedlared Illegal Mer. er of the America, Cort and Continental Tobacco Cps. Into Present American Tobacco Co.
Newark, N-J., Jan. 5.-A sui rought by George A. Belling, o Bayonne, to have declarec illega the merger of the -American, the ansolidated, and the Continenta obacco Companies into the pres nt American Tobacco Company was conditionally dismissed by Vice Chancellor Pitney to-day.
Belling held 100 shares of 8 ver ent. preferred stock in the olc Amricar' Tobacco Company. In the nerger agreement holders of al preferred stock in the old American and th: other companies were forc ed to take for their holdings the 6 ercent- bonds of the new compay. It was Bellings contention tha he new company had no legal ight to substitute these bonds for he old stock without the consent o he owners
Vice Chancellor Pitney, in his opinion, suggested that Belling accept 8 per cent. on his stock payale quarterly from the date of the merger to expiration of the charter of the old American Tobacco Company, and that he then be paid par or his holdings. If he fails to accept this relief or either of two offers of settlement which have been made y the company the court will dis miss the bill of complaint uncondiionally.
