FIRE AT SOUTH OF THE LOSSES.

South Boston, one of the most thriving towns in Southside Virginia, was devastated by fire last Thursday evening. Thei flames started in the machine room of the R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Stemery, and before any one could stop the tide a half dozen buildings were in flames. We get the fallowing account of the fire from the Durham Herald of Saturday morning.

The heaviest losers was R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Company, who lost about \$130,000. This loss was fairly well covered by insurance. The fire originated in the Reynolds plant, starting in one of the drying machine. It spread rapidly and at one time it looked as if most of the town would go as a sacrifice to the fiery element.

The fire started at 3 o'clock in the afternoon and within an hour it was seen that the town was in danger. Help was first ask of Danville, who had a steamer at work within two and one half hours. Then help was asked of Lynchburg but the help could not be sent, this resulting in the call sent to Durham The fire was under control at 9;30 o'clock in the euening, this being after it had been burning for six and one halfhours.
