There was considerable enthusiasm manifested in the assembly, especially among the boys and young men as the speaker magnified the occupation of the tiller of the soil Hee advised that large fields be ade so that long rows might be had so as to prevent the loss o me in turning, that farms should be devided and fenced with wire for pasturage that all kinds of stock should be raised, large horses, also cattle and sheep and hogs, that clover and the grasses should be sown largely for grazing, for the enriching of the soil, that labor saving machinery should, by all means be used, suctras one and two hors corn planters, reapers and binder and mowers, that the strictest care should be had in the selection of orn for seed that an effort should e made to make more corn to the cre.
He reccommended the flat cul Hre, with harrows and double shovels, The time is past for running four furrows to the row, i can't be afforded.
There is no doubt, that good re sults will come from the lectures of hat day and should be repeated annually.
While other pursuits are indespensible; farming is the-support of all business and the country and should be managed wisely.
