WE consider one of the important Associations, of the State, and one in which the State at large can gain greatly by these being well attended, it is that of the State Association of County Commissioners, which is to meet shortly at Wrightsville Beach. We hope Person county will be represented, it will be money well spent by sending one of our Commissioners there to represent this county. In speaking of this meeting a Raleigh correspondent say:

"There is every indication now that the State Association of County Commissioners, will be held at Wrightsville Beach, August 9 to 11. The last legislature passed a special act endorsing the association and its work and authorizing the commissioners of every county to send one or more of their number as delegates to the annual meetings of the association at which matters of vital interest to the improvement of county government are discussed, especially that of the economical administration of the county finances. It is understood that there is very wide interest in the approaching annual meeting, the first since the legislature provided for counties to bear the expense of the commissioners in attending, and there is every promise of very many counties being represented.

### Death of Oldest Rural Carrier.

Friday night Mr. Jacob S. Little, of Lanes Creek, Union county, grandfather of Rural Carrier C. A. Little, of Lexington, died of paralysis in the Presbyterian hospital at Charlotte. He was 79 years old, and was the oldest rural mail carrier, it is said in the United States, certainly the oldest in the state. He was the father of the rural service in Union county. On the 5th, while attending the convention of rural carriers in Charlotte, he sustained a stroke and it finally carried him off. Five sons and six daughters survive him, one son, Dr. J. B. Little, dentist, living at Newton, several in Union county, and several in Georgia. The interment was with Masonic honors Sunday.

### Special Legislative Session?

In view of the fact that congress will submit the question of levying an income tax to the various legislatures, the question is being asked if there will be a special session of the North Carolina legislature to consider the subject. The constitution requires that the states vote on a constitutional amendment. It is believed that North Carolina will favor such a tax overwhelmingly.

## NEWS FROM BROOKLAND.

Editor of Courier:—

The Farmers Institute held in Roxboro on the 14th inst. (of which mention in your issue, of that date was made) was indeed an interesting occasion, Farmer Scott as well as the other Lecturer held the attention and spoke to the edification of all present from start to finish.

There was considerable enthusiasm manifested in the assembly, especially among the boys and young men as the speaker magnified the occupation of the tiller of the soil.

He advised that large fields be made so that long rows might be had so as to prevent the loss of time in turning, that farms should be divided and fenced with wire for pasturage that all kinds of stock should be raised, large horses, also cattle and sheep and hogs, that clover and the grasses should be sown largely for grazing, for the enriching of the soil, that labor saving machinery should, by all means be used, such as one and two horse corn planters, reapers and binders and mowers, that the strictest care should be had in the selection of corn for seed that an effort should be made to make more corn to the acre.

He recommended the flat culture, with harrows and double shovels. The time is past for running four furrows to the row, it can't be afforded.

There is no doubt, that good results will come from the lectures of that day and should be repeated annually.

While other pursuits are indispensable; farming is the support of all business and the country and should be managed wisely.

The Quarterly meeting was held according to appointment, at Helena, on the 3rd Sunday and the church dedicated to God for his worship. All the churches were represented, except one.

This writer spent Saturday night with Mr. Edwin Moore who is a genius, talented and intelligent, owns a valuable mill, and is the father of 6 pretty, smart children. Such was his entertainment as a host and conversationalist that much the largest portion of the night, (as it was two o'clock in the morning when we retired for sleep and rest) was taken in talking about matters and things in general, and of poets and orators, mills, music and musicians and the lineage of the Moore family for the last 600 years, or centuries if you prefer.

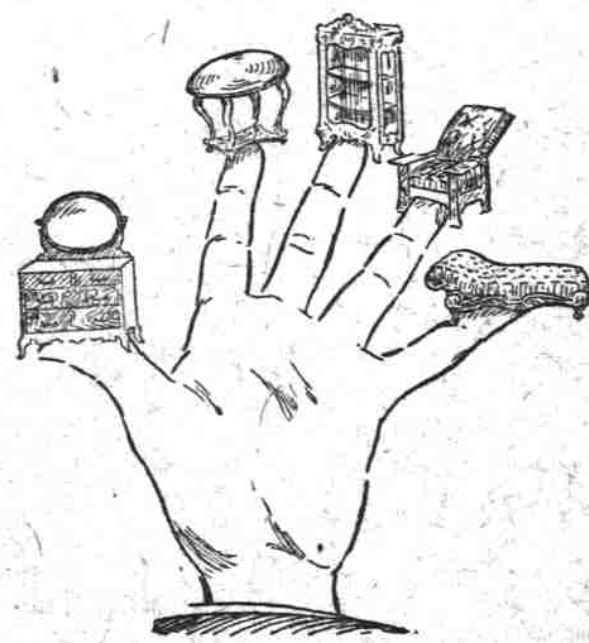
