THE KING OF ENGLAND VICTIM OF PNEUMONIA.

V is Proclaimed King.

London, By Cable.-King Edward VII, who returned to England from a vacation ten days ago in the best of health, died at 11:45 o'clock Friday night in the presence of his family after an illness of less than a week, which was serious hardly more than three days.

The Prince of Wales succeeded to the throne immediately, according to the laws of the kingdom, without official ceremony His first official act was to dispatch to the Lord Mayor the announcement of his father's death in pursuance of custom.

Pneumonia, following bronchitis, is believed to have been the cause of death, but the doctors thus far have refused to make a statement. Some of the King's friends are convinced that worry over the critical political situation which confronted him, with sleepless nights, aggravated if it did not cause the fatal ill-
