**EXPENSIVE TRUST BUSTING.**

Fifty-nine thousand dollars was the amount paid Frank B. Kellogg the Republican trust-buster, by the government, between 1907 and 1911. It is believed that Kellogg received as much, if not more, from the trusts. It was developed before the Stanley committee that in one instance he received fees from the steel trust while being paid by the government to prosecute its friend and ally, the oil trust.

J. B. McReynolds, another "trust-buster" received \$61,000 from the public treasury for his services in the tobacco ann coal carrying railroad cases. In all the Republicans spent more than \$3,000,000 in ten years for "trust busting" and the trusts are still with us.
