At the meeting of the State oard of Agriculture last week, the editor of thi spaper introduced a resolution establishing a division of marketing and rural o-operation, to be operated uner the joint auspices of the Department of Agriculture and A. & M. Col ege. President H. Q. Alexander, of the Farmers Union, also appeared before the coard and strong y seconded the resolution. The board then unan mously approved it and votel an appropriation at the rate of not less than \$5,000 nor more than \$10,000 for the first twelve months. 
