## PERSON COUNTY 1850 TO 1865

### Reminiscences No. 4, By A. R. Foushee.

Editor Courier:

I have concluded to change my program for this letter by giving a list of names of many heads of families (and some old batchelors too) who lived in the County during this period and make the list entirely from memory as I have not consulted any record, nor asked, any one for information on the subject, these names are listed by townships, the location of individuals may not be correct in some instances as the county was laid off in districts then instead of townships as it is now, the lines may not be identical, but the names given are correct, as I was personally acquainted with the most of them and knew of the balance of them. The most of these men were splendid citizens of which any county might be proud, and whose posterity should hold in great remembrance. (I do not include the names of any persons who lived in the town of Roxboro, as their names were listed in a former letter).
