## ALDERMEN COMPLETE THE TAX LEVY FOR 1917

R. L. Harris Appointed Member of Board to Fill Vacancy Caused by C. T. Wilson's Resignation—Maximum Tax On All Funds

In a called meeting last Friday night, the town board of aldermen completed the tax levy for 1917, which is as follows: General Fund, \$3 1-3, poll, \$1.00; Street Poll, \$1.00; School Bond Tax, 25c, poll, 75c; Street and Water Bond Tax, 25c, poll 75c; Graded School Tax, 40c, poll \$1.20; Street Improvement Bond Tax 15c, poll 45c. There were two funds that were not taxed to the limit, both of these being raised by the present board. The School Bond Tax was raised from 16 2-3 to 25, the maximum. This was done on account of the fact that ten years has passed and no sinking fund is on hand at present, and only 20 years is left before the maturity of these bonds. Almost a third of the bond issue should now be in the banks as a sinking fund to take care of the bonds at maturity. Street and Water Bond tax was raised from 20 to 25c, which is the maximum. Mr. R. L. Harris was appointed by the board as an alderman to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. C. T. Wilson. He was appointed clerk to the board at the same salary of his predecessor.

## BELGIUM WILL BE RESTORED ON THE DAY OF VICTORY

### WILSON SPEAKS TO BELGIANS

### Belgian Mission, Headed by Baron Moncheur, Spend Their First Day in the Capitol Paying Official Calls

Washington, June 18.—In greeting Belgium's war mission Monday, President Wilson expressed America's "solemn determination that on the inevitable day of victory Belgium shall be restored to the place she has so richly won among the self-respecting and respected nations of the earth." The commissioners spent their first day in Washington paying official calls. Secretary Lansing accompanied them to the White House, where Baron Moncheur, head of the mission, handed to the President Wilson a personal letter from King Albert and expressed in a short address Belgium's gratitude for America's aid.

"Since the first days of the greatest tragedy which has ever befallen humanity," said the baron, "Belgium has contracted an immense debt of gratitude to the generous American nation. In a magnificent outburst of sympathy for the little country which had chosen to defy a powerful and pitiless enemy rather than to tarnish its honor or forswear its pledged word the initiative of American citizens gave to the unfortunate victims of German cruelty in Belgium the most splendid evidences of generosity. But the chivalrous sentiments which animate the people of the United States went further than this when President Wilson, giving an admirable example of disinterested power, uttered the words well fitted to make us tremble with hope and to cause us to fix our eyes confidently upon the starry banner which has become more than ever the symbol of strength placed at the service of the highest and most pure principles.

"Yes, Belgium will again take her place among the nations. The enemy brought us massacre and devastation, but there still remains to the Belgian people their soil made fertile by the toil of their ancestors; there still remains to Belgium an industrious population of unconquerable energy. "Leaning upon the young, strong and generous hand which the American people holds out to her, Belgium once she is delivered from the oppression of the enemy, will arise and throwing aside the odious weight of foreign occupation will proudly resume the path of progress in the light of the sun of liberty."

President Wilson, thanking Baron Moncheur and through him King Albert, said in reply: "Your excellency is good enough to express the thanks of the Belgian people for the participation of America in feeding the people of your stricken country. This work in which so many Americans have been enthusiastically engaged since the beginning of the war, is one which has brought as much benefit to them as to the innocent civilian population whom it was intended to aid.

"America engaged upon this work as being the only means, however, inadequate, of expressing our deep and sincere admiration for the valiant nation that has gone forth unhesitatingly to meet the onslaughts of a ruthless enemy rather than sacrifice her honor and her self-respect. "The American people have been able to understand and glory in the unflinching heroism of the Belgian people and their sovereign and there is not one among us who does not today welcome the opportunity of expressing to you the heart-felt sympathy and friendship, and our solemn determination that on the inevitable day of victory, Belgium shall be restored to the place she has so richly won among the self-respecting nations of the earth."

The visitors were entertained Monday night at a formal White House dinner. The diners included Vice-President Marshall, the Belgian minister, Chief Justice White, Speaker Clark, members of the cabinet, a number of congressional leaders, and high officers of the army and navy.
