AUCTION SALES.

It has been announced that there would be no more sales of tobacco the old auction way in Roxboro. Now, we hope the Co-operative Tobacco Marketing Association will not think because there will be sales the old auction way in Roxboro that it is an attempt to antagonize the new way of selling, for such is not the case. There is no attempt on the part of any one to hinder or in any way interfere with the Co-operative Association method, but we are sure when the signers of the Co-operative think for a moment they will see how necessary it is, for this season at least, for there to be a warehouse run here on the old plan. There are some farmers in this County who have not been able to see their way clear to join the Association, and they may have been just as honest in their views as those who joined, and if there is no warehouse in Roxboro where they can sell their tobacco it will be necessary for them to carry their tobacco to Danville, Winston-Salem, South Boston or some other market where there is auction sales, for, as we have heard the speakers declare, no one not a member of the Association can sell their tobacco with the Co-operative Marketing Association.

In justice to those who have not signed, and it is estimated that there will be anywhere from twenty five per cent to forty per cent in the County who are not members, there should be some place for these farmers to sell their tobacco, and in jus-

tice to the merchants and business men of the town these farmers should not be forced to cart their tobacco away and thus deprive this section of such a large part of business which rightfully belongs to this section.

We are informed that there will be a warehouse here run the old auction way and those who have not

joined the Association will be able to market their tobacco without having to go to other markets. This conclusion has been reached after mature deliberation, without prejudice to any but with a sincere desire to see justice done those who have not been convinced that the new way is the best way.

We sincerely trust there will be no

ill-engendered and the markets will work in harmony, and if at the end of the year it is proven that this new way is the way, then may all combine and one hundred per cent of the farmers join in and make the new way unanimous.
