Finding this amount too small they called another election a few weeks ago and raised their local tax rate from 10 cts. to 30 cts. on the \$100.00 worth of property. Not satisfied yet, last week they had another election at the same tax rate and voted in about ten thousand acres of land as an addition to their High School district. I wonder what they will do next.
