The lesson subject should not be, as suggested by the lesson' committee, Judah's plea, but rather Joseph's forgiving love. The emphasis should not be primarily upon the sinning and pen-iteut brothers, but upon the magnanimous and forgiving brother, Joseph.
1. Joseph's Elevation to the Pro-

miership of Egypt (41:14-44).

The circumstances which led to his elevation from prison to the position of prime minister were:
