REVIVAL AT HIGH POINT

Virgilina, Va., Sept. 1.—Sunday was a full day here in the religious circles. All denominations met in the Erick Warehouse Sunday morning and were addressed by Dr. Law, the famous evangelist, who is conducting a revival here.

Sunday afternoon a Sunday school comprising Florence Avenue, Annis Chapel, Grassy Creek and Olive Branch church was held.

Each church was well represented and Atty. B. W. Parham and Rev. Page of Oxford, N. C., addressed the congregation very effectively on the great work of the Sunday Schools.

Rev. T. B. Hill made a splendid talk on the relation of the Sunday school to the church.

At the conclusion of this service, Mrs. Garner, Supt. of the Sunbeam Organization held a very interesting meeting with the Sunbeams.

Sunday night the revival services that have been in progress for the past week reached a high point. The crowd was estimated to be around fifteen hundred. Dr. Law was at his best and preached a most powerful sermon, using as his subject, "The trail of the Serpent."

He made a bitter attack on the modern dance and card playing, and expressed his denunciations in plain language.

He proved by statistics that one girl was lost by the dance every eight minutes.
