RECTAL AILMENTS

Just why people should be so reserved or diffident about this very important part of the human body may be accounted for by the centuries of custom preceding the present day; fiction writers, some of them, are not nearly so nice in the stuff they "get by" with.

Rectal diseases, if neglected, may develop into fatal conditions. That is a very good reason why our people should understand more than they usually do, of rectal conditions. An inefficient rectum may bring on auto-intoxication, which in time undermines the constitution. Then, so-called piles—hemorrhoids, warn us of impending trouble; the good physician should be consulted at once, no false modesty preventing. To try to cure a case of constipation in the

presence of rectal tumors will prove futile of course—until the obstructions are removed.

Much capital is made by charlatans, of neglected rectums. Thousands of dollars are spent annually by our people for "mild, resolute treatment" by the heartless quack, who would place his advertisements on the front page, if permitted by the artful editor—he generally orates over next the "want ads." He often gathers to himself many shekels for a very simple procedure, which the family physician should attend to for a modest hire.

Constipation and "piles" are two conditions, one of which aggravates the other always; the first step to correct the indisposition is, get rid of the organic element of the case. In the acute form, rectal inflammation may be relieved—cured—by medicines; in chronic forms, surgery may be absolutely necessary, and is neither dangerous or disabling, if done by competent hands.

Remember that cancer is one of the grave possibilities of a neglected case of hemorrhoids. Trust no one with your case who is not well-known, honest, capable.
