Scribes Report: Minutes of last meeting (Optional). Reception of new members and swearing them in.

Awarding of honors (Occasional). 7:50 p.m. Second period. Twenty minutes. Period of activity.

Marching or staff drill, or setting up exercises, or signal drill, or Scout pace. Give every Scout a chance to drill and command his troop. Develop leaders.

8:10 p.m. Third period. Twenty minutes. Period of inactivity. Scout School: Instruction by patrols or groups. An inspector for each, selected at the previous meeting.

Or Expert instructor for the troop in birds, astronomy, or map making. Or Patrol meetings in charge of the patrol leader. Practice Scouting. Demonstrations.

8:30 p.m. Fourth period. Twenty minutes. Period of activity. Scout games: Games in charge of some Scout previously appointed.

Or Story Telling: A Scoutmaster's big opportunity. Pick out good stories.

8:50 p.m. Fifth period: Ten minutes only. Closing exercises. Cheers, Yells, Announcements, Flag Ceremony, Scout Oath and laws, Traps, Great Scoutmasters' Benediction.

Training School Started
