W. A. Whitfield has a nice field of corn and soy beans growing in alternate rows, the rows being spaced 3 feet apart and the corn left a little thicke rin the drill for the six ft. row than for the ordinary 4 ft. row. This gives the same number of stalks per acre and will not cut down the yield of corn while the beans are growing. Next year, the rows will be changed, the corn will be planted on the soy bean row after they have been turned under, and the beans will be planted on the corn row. There is a scarcity of corn in the county, the yield per acre is far too low, and this system will mean more corn per acre if 3000 farmers will adopt and stick to it as they stick to tobacco.


