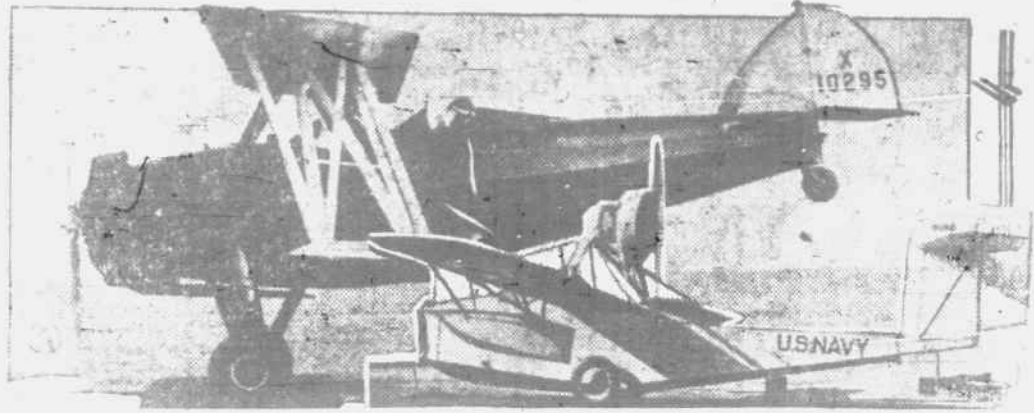

ROXBORO TOBACCO MARKET CLOSED FOR THE SEASON

Sales For The Season Were
More Than Six Million
Pounds

The Roxboro tobacco market closed last Friday and we doubt if there has ever been a season which was more trying on all the producers, the buyer and the warehousemen. There was discontent, grumbling and dissatisfaction every day. The price being such that the farmer thought he was not getting a fair price and the warehousemen were being treated of satisfaction. The buyers claimed the prices offered were unsatisfactory and they were doing the best they could under the circumstances.

The market was closed for the season because the price was so low that the farmers would not sell their tobacco. The average price for the season was \$12.35. The total sales for the season were more than six million pounds.
