Louisiana Lieutenant Governor Says He Is Going To Put "Out The Best Ticket"

New Orleans, Sept. 23-Smarting from being ignored by the Huey P. Long machine, Lieutenant Governor James A. Noe today said he was going to put "out the best ticket in the field" in the January democratic primary.

Left off the administration ticket after he had jumped the gun and announced his candidacy for governor, Noe engaged in a fist fight with a Long leader at Monroe yesterday and returned here with a bruised left hand today to announce his opposition to the regular machine.
