Three Negroes Are **Caught With Stolen** Goods Saturday

Lodged In Jail By Officers Pending Hearing. Wilburn & Satterfield Victimized

Three negroes, John Edward White, Jr., Andrew Lowrey and John Evans were lodged in jail Saturday, charged with larceny of two boxes of underwear from Wilburn and Sattrfield, local merchants. It is understood that a pair of pants was also taken by one of the negroes, but they were recovered before the men left the

A truck operated by John Edward White, Jr., and alleged to be owned by John White, negro of Durham, crashed into the car of Walter Morris of Woodsdale, N. C. on Hotel St. here. The negro abandoned his truck after the wreck, and investigating officers found the two boxes of underwear, which are alleged to be the goods stolen from Wilburn and Satterfield. White, Jr. was lodged in jail on a charge of reckless and careless driving and injury to property.

Later the other two negroes, Andrew Lowery and John Evans, were arrested and placed in jail, being charged with theft, along with White. They are now in jail awaiting a hear-
