There is such a city-wide revolt against the old system—where so much is needed to be done, and no funds to do it with, that the necessity for a bond issue is urgent in our desire to extend our growth.

Wilmington, April 27.—Lem Thung, the Wilmington Chinaman, who recently returned from his native country after several years' sojourn there will not be deported. The North Carolina delegation took up Thung's case at the request of leading citizens of Wilmington, and the Secretary of Commerce and Labor has ruled that he is "a progressive and Americanized Chinese" and can remain in this country. 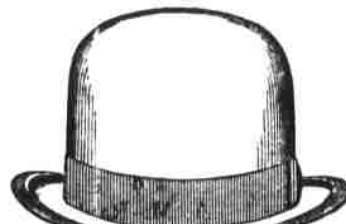
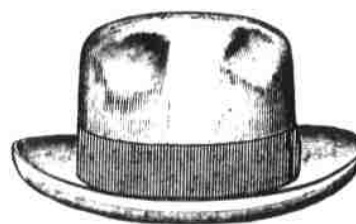
