NEWLAND WILL RUN
L. Governor Newland holds to his first announcement that he will be a candidate for the Democratic nomination for Governor. Under ordinary circumstances this announcement would constitute a matter somewhat as bold as Mr. Newland and Mr. Craig are from the west, but it seems that it is a foregone conclusion that Mr. Craig will practically be nominated before the convention meets. AS TO SUPERINTENDENT OF HEALTH

The most important and far-reaching thing done by any health authority in this country during the year 1910 was done yesterday in the city of Greensboro. Dr. McAnally, superintendent of health, issued a proclamation which has been the subject of many newspaper articles, and has been the subject of much discussion in the city. The proclamation is a declaration of war against poverty, ignorance, crime, superstition, disease and death. When all of our people are taught the real nature and causes of disease and lantern slides and gross and microscopic specimens are used to demonstrate the truth of the teaching then they will believe and within three years more than one third of the sickness we now have in this county will be prevented. The prevention of disease is a great and alluring subject and the practicality of the proposition is admitted throughout the entire civilized world. In many places much has already been accomplished in the way of disease prevention. The Panama Canal zone has been made as healthy as High Point. Yellow fever has been driven out of Havana, bubonic plague has been kept from gaining a foothold on our Pacific coast, the cities of Washington and New York have in the last eight years been able to prevent one half of the usual summer sickness and death among infants, England and the state of New York have made a reduction of over forty per cent in the morbidity and death from tuberculosis, in the German empire small pox has been practically abolished and Japan during her recent war with Russia was able to prevent more than sixty per cent of the usual sickness and death therefrom in time of war, in the last twenty years the kingdom of Sweden has increased average length of human life from thirty eight years (Continued on page 3.)
