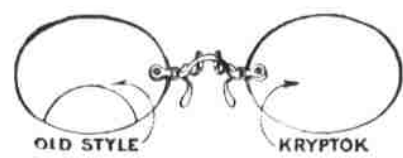

Elections held yesterday in many states and cities throughout the country resulted in the election of Democratic governors in Massachusetts, Kentucky and Mississippi, a Republican governor in Rhode Island, a Republican victory in New York, which will challenge the administration of Governor Dix's policies in New Jersey legislation with major probability not in accord with the Woodrow Wilson administration in Maryland and New Mexico still in doubt.

Senatorial gains marked elections today and gave that party power in districts where there had been doubt as to an accounting vote.

In Massachusetts, N. Y. the voters elected a majority, all except one exception, and a majority in the senate and in all of the governor's offices. In Rhode Island, Schreyer was elected governor, and in New York, the voters elected a majority in the senate and in all of the governor's offices.
