

WHERE CREDIT IS DUE

It is a source of great pride to the people of this community—who have the High Point spirit—that it shall grow to greater things, by expansion into greater fields of its industrial life—to see the sweeping victory won by the furniture manufacturers for lower rates. Last April when Mayor Tate together with the furniture manufacturers of the state met here and offered evidence before Examiner Gibson—this became the entering wedge—the beginning of the fight which was to be carried forward until a successful finish should crown our efforts in behalf of freight rate adjustment. The victory has been won, and we want to say that this is due more to the tireless energies on behalf of our aggressive mayor than any one else.

The victory is just the beginning—it will eventually liberate High Point (and we speak first of our town because of the comparative large output of furniture here and our losses are heaviest) and the state at large from an evil that has sapped the industrial life of the commonwealth for years.

The meeting of the Municipal Association which convenes in High Point on January 7 will no doubt enter largely into this decision and will begin a work of upbuilding which will be state wide.

High Point can now put its furniture on the Pacific coast on the same freight basis as furniture from New York, Pennsylvania, Virginia and the west. This applies also to chairs. Has there ever been any just reason why it should not have always had the same advantage? Stop and think what High Point has paid in excess freight charges.

THE ONLY PERMANENT REMEDY.

The only permanent remedy for discriminatory freight rates—an evil that is virtually killing out all business growth in North

Carolina, is to make it unlawful by act of Congress for any railroad to charge more for a short haul than a long haul, where the short haul is embraced in the long haul and in the same direction.

THAT FAVORED ZONE OF VIRGINIA.

The Interstate Commerce Commission, in its decision putting Carolina cities on an equal freight footing with Virginia cities, has somewhat destroyed "Virginia's Favored Freight Zone."

The commission decided that the Southern Railway Company by its present adjustment of rates did violate the spirit and intent of the fourth section of the act and granted the application of the shippers the relief sought.

2. That the existing rates on furniture and chairs from Carolina territory to all Pacific Coast terminals was unduly discrimination or prejudicial against the Carolina Manufacturers.

3. That the existing rates were unjust and unreasonably high.
