attracted more attention than the President's advocacy of free wool. A convention of wool growers quickly assembled in Washington. They anathematized Mr. Cleveland and demonstrated to their entire satisfaction that no administration could stand that had the audacity to advocate such a measure. They proscribed the American people.

The Ways and Means Committee...
has issued the lead of their illustrious chief, the St. Louis Convention responded to the demand of the people and made free wool a part of the platform, and now Congress, with singular unanimity, has passed the bill for the free wool.

The enemies of the wool...
were right in considering free wool as the most important feature of that measure. It is the Gibraltar of Democracy. The enemy brought all their batteries to bear upon it, and it repulsed, and silenced every hostile gun.

The idea that free wool means...
to the sheep grower is positively absurd. Has a rich tariff kept up the price of wool? Never was domestic wool cheaper than it has been under the present high tariff. Sheep have been sold for market because their wool was not high worth anything.

The truth is that domestic wool...
is low because there is a limited demand for it. Our manufacturers are not willing to pay a high price for their clothes and carpets by the tariff enhanced cost of foreign wool of a quality not produced here, that they must have to make the best quality of goods. These goods are sold here, and exported in spite of the tariff, and cost an average of 50 per cent more than they should.

Above all these special interests...
however, is the right of the people to cheaper and better clothing.
