WASHINGTON LETTER.

Mr. Tomlinson Gives Some Interesting Facts About Government Money Treasury and Sub-Treasuries.

Personals—Business Looking up.

Mr. J. S. Tomlinson

one of the most useful and efficient officers here from N. C. has returned to the Treasury Department in connection with the transfer of the sub-treasuries from the old to the new Assistant Treasury U. S.

In answer to questions relative to this special work Mr. Tomlinson says "sub-treasuries are branch offices of the financial part of the Treasury Dept. or outlying depots of the storage of Treasury funds as a matter of convenience for the government and as an accommodation for banks, clearing houses, and individuals holding checks on the Assistant Treasurer.

Through these channels the receipts of National banks, the customs and other government receipts are deposited to the credit of the Department and banks and like institutions are supplied with funds without the expense and risk incident to transportation from Washington. There are nine Sub-Treasuries in the United States and they tend to relieve a congestion of funds in Washington as well as to accommodate the business public by a distribution of the funds in different parts of the country. Uncle Sam's money in full particulars deposited in Sub-Treasuries is as follows:

Baltimore \$11,000,000.00; Boston \$14,000,000.00; New Orleans \$19,000,000.00; New York \$14,000,000.00; Philadelphia \$21,000,000.00; St. Louis \$36,000,000.00; Cincinnati \$6,000,000.00; Chicago \$20,000,000.00; San Francisco \$26,000,000.00.

The affair of Sub-Treasuries are managed by assistants and officers appointed by the Secretary of the Treasury and they are placed under heavy bonds for the safe keeping of the funds. Whenever the business is changed a Committee is sent from the Department to take an inventory of funds and conduct the formal transfer to the new man.

Mr. W. D. Bigger, prominent Democrat and business man of Clearfield, Pa., having been appointed Assistant Treasurer at Philadelphia and a time having been made for the transfer, the Treasury Committee went there August 13 and at the close of that day's business counted the cash remaining on hand in the bank and each teller in charge of the vaults and practically took charge of the funds of the Sub-Treasuries.

The outgoing Assistant Treasurer submitted his report showing how much was in each vault. After being satisfied that these statements harmonized with the record in the Department the actual transfer began and as soon as one vault was finished it was turned over to the new man and so on until the work was completed.

The balance sheets showed that the vaults contained a total of \$21,000,000.00 in round numbers, which amount was finally received for by the new Assistant Treasurer.

The paper was counted by bills. This consisted principally of Treasury notes, and gold and silver certificates. Each class and each denomination having been carefully separated, and arranged in packages there was a confusion in verifying the amount of the bills in each package, this amount having been noted on the jackets and checked with the bills in packages who made the tally counted the package and then similarly checked by the present committee if found correct.

The gold, and silver and copper coins, and the vaults in strong canvas bags the bulk of which was verified by weight. About half of the funds on hand were silver dollars, \$1,000.00 in every bag each bag weighing 900. One bag was taken from the vault and counted, and having been found correct was used as a "test bag" in weighing the others. The bag was placed on one scale in the same manner, the balance scales and then all the others one at a time were placed on the other side and if the scale tipped evenly it was passed as correct. If it was not right the light bag was opened and the money counted, dollar by dollar.

The half dollars, quarters, dimes, nickels and pennies were disposed of in the same manner, except in the case of all "uncurrent coin" which was counted, "uncurrent coin" is the designation by which all denominations of gold and silver are known when they have been in circulation until they would not weigh evenly with new money. The loss by wear is surprising for \$1,000.00 of any denomination will weigh several pounds in the aggregate after a few years constant circulation. In this transfer only two small shortages were found. One bag of 2,000 bronze pennies was missing, which was made good by the vault clerk, being responsible for all entire packages placed in his charge. One \$50.00 bag of nickels was short \$1.25 which amount was made up by the lady counter whose initials appeared on the bag.

All the weighing and counting was done in the presence of two men, one representing the old and the other the new Assistant Treasurer.
