DEMOCRATIZATION OF SILVER  
Some Facts Not Generally Known as to How This was Accomplished.

The act which demonetized silver was passed through a Republican Congress and signed by a Republican President, very few of whom voted for the act knowing that it was designed to accomplish this end.

No vote was ever taken for or against the demonetization of silver. No bill for demonetizing silver could ever have received ten votes in the Senate and House combined.

Silver was demonetized by a trick, and it was not until a year after it had been done that the fact was known either to the President or the Secretary of the Treasury.

The first general knowledge that was obtained of it came through the report of the Director of the Mint, who had carried it through to the President in a private letter.

No one by reading the bill would have known that it demonetized silver. It merely outlined the word "dollar" from the list of legal silver coins, and as there had not been a wrapper containing demonetization stamps issued for the silver, the only supposed such a thing possible, the demonetization would not have been noticed at the time.

Nearly a year after it was passed Congress returned to the subject of silver dollars. The minting of silver dollars was resumed, and the Government began to issue them.

By the time it was impossible to demonetize the coins. The egg to an omnibus cannot be resolved to its original position. This act of the United States government, which has been the subject of much discussion, is a great blot on the name of the United States.
