A Handsome Memorial Window Presented to Salem Female College by the Class of 1894.

Winston, N. C., Feb. 14.—A handsome memorial window in honor of North Carolina's lamented Senator, Zebulon B. Vance, was placed in Salem Female college today.

The window is 3 1/2 feet high and is made throughout ofopal glass. The pattern is known as a Lily design, being a group of tall Easter lilies, with lilies of the valley clustering at the base of the group.

The window will be formally presented to the college by the class at the annual commencement in May.

SLEIGHING IN NEW ORLEANS.

Advices from different sections of Louisiana and Mississippi were to the effect that snow had fallen all around.

Money! Did you say Money? Well, really, there is nothing so universally popular as money.

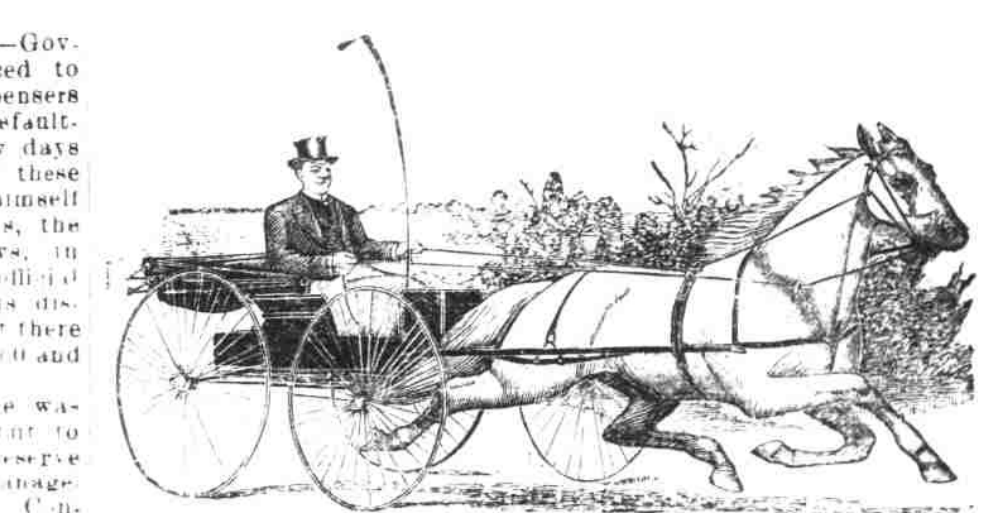
