No Fight for Control of Senate Committee.

Certainty of Speaker Reed Succeeding Himself as Speaker. McKinley and Queen Lili. Office Seekers Must Secure Proper Endorsements.

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 12.—

The excitement which was prevalent among Senators early this week over the prospect of a fight between the Republicans and silver men for the control of the Senate committee did not end so suddenly as it began. The Populists and silver Republicans were very anxious that the Democrats should combine with them for the fight, and for a time it looked as though they might do so, but after the Democratic caucus there was a change in the situation. It has been asserted that the change was brought about by an agreement between the Democrats and Republicans to allow things to remain as they are, and by the retirement of Mr. Gorman, who is a silver man and whose name is the movement of gold men with 200,000 to send the credentials of the Senators appointed by the Governors of Kentucky, Florida, and Oregon to the Electoral committee and to the House of Representatives, but all the same when the House meets Mr. A. T. Wood applied to the Senate Blackburn, of Kentucky, and presented, Senator H. H. Wilson motion that he be sworn in. Senator Gorman's motion to let the Electoral committee nominate him was voted down "under the circumstances" in which he would antagonize Mr. Gorman's cause. Mr. Gorman is chairman of the Democraatic caucus.

So assured is it that Mr. H. H. Wilson will be re-elected Speaker of the House that there is next to no interest whatever in Washington in the various candidates held Saturday night to nominate others. It is also understood that all other officers are to be nominated. The Democrats, who can elect nothing, are having a red-hot fight over their nomination for Speaker, which is to be made Monday morning, because the man who receives the nomination will be regarded as the party leader in the House. The Populists will also nominate a candidate for Speaker.

President McKinley is proving himself more of a diplomat than he has ever been credited with being. A case in point is the manner in which he handled the application of ex-Queen Liliokalani of Hawaii, whose recent admission to the Diplomatic gallery of the Senate upon the personal request of Secretary of Stateman made quite a stir in diplomatic circles, for a private interview. The interview was in writing, but the answer was given verbally to the ex-secretary and was to the effect that she could take her place in the time when daily gathers in the East Room at a certain of seeing the President at any time, but that no private interview would be granted her now.

Some 10,000 applications for offices which were received at Canton between the election and the inauguration, were this week sent to the several departments under which the offices applied for are. It required a big two-horse wagon to carry the boxes in which these applications were packed.

Senator Hanna's private secretary, Mr. S. A. Perkins, gets just \$1,200 more than either a Senator or Representative does, and is consequently entitled to the secretaries of all the other public offices in Washington. Mr. Perkins gets \$1,200 on the regular pay roll of the Senate, as Senator Hanna gives him the \$500 a year he will get as Senator.

Secretary Wilson is running the Department of Agriculture like he had been there a year, instead of a week. One of the things he has done which seem to be excellent was to contract for 600,000 tons of sugar beet seed, which he intended to distribute to American States, which have suitable soil and climate to raise sugar beets. Five farmers in every country in those States will be assisted in getting their seeds and report results. Secretary Wilson sees no good reason for our importing beet sugar from Germany, which we can just as well grow the best sugar in the sugar ourselves.

A score of almost Presidential masters find themselves barred from office because no commissions were issued to them by Mr. Cleveland. President McKinley can sign these commissions but the pressure which members of his own party will bring to bear for the time places them in their future political bonds prepared to burst.

President McKinley has played it safe on the Senators and Representatives in the office question, if some of them have given it out straight. His efforts in making the Senators and Representatives take the responsibility of deciding up the men from their states, who should receive whatever offices may be allotted to that State, and has said that when he gets ready to consider general appointments, which will not be for several months, he will appoint his hosts who does not secure the endorsement of his party in the Congressional delegations from his state. Major McKinley is reported to have told all of his personal friends who are opponents for a diplomatic position that he would not consider his application unless he secured the endorsement of his Congressional delegation, because of this rule, although he knows the man much better than the Senators and Representatives do in his state.
