While there is nothing like a senate at the Washington headquarters of the Marine Hospital service, over the yellow fever on the Mississippi coast, the situation is regarded as serious and the Surgeon General of the service returned from his vacation and took personal charge of the arrangements made to try to confine the disease to its present locality, and he is confident that they will succeed. The latest reports class the yellow fever at Ocean Springs, Miss., as a very mild type of the disease.

BAPTISTS UNITE.

Twenty Churches of the Anti-Missionaries Come Over.

Confess to Murder. State Fair Marshals. Commissioner Talks About Cotton Crop. College Matters. Major Nielson a Good Stayer.

The Primitive Baptists there thousands of the "regulars" and are as a general thing known as the "Hard Shells" and are quite strong in this State. It is learned today that 20 churches of this denomination in the Wilkes and Surry section will at once become Missionary Baptists. Rev. John E. White will go there in a few days to receive them. Four years ago the late Rev. Dr. Columbus Durham received an entire association of them. 25 churches, as Missionary Baptists. From time immemorial they have been anti-missionary.

Persons who came in from the Southern part of this county say that a man and his son have confessed the murder of a woman for which at the last term of court here, Berry Cook was sent to the penitentiary for 20 years.

Chief Marshal P. H. Lybrook of the State Fair will have a large staff and his headquarters will be at the Park hotel. He expects 75 assistant Marshals, besides those from Raleigh. Thirty-four have already accepted.

The Commissioner of Agriculture says he is getting letters daily regarding the crops. One today from Maxton says the cotton is so greatly damaged by the drought that it continues a few days longer there will be only a crop. The Commissioner then said: "I can say from me, a farmer of 30 years experience, that if the seasons are right in June, July and August, in spite of drought and everything else the crop of cotton will be an average one. I don't care what happens. Of course when people pitched their hopes so high and cotton was so magnificent as it was August, it appears to them now as if the crops were pretty nearly destroyed. The average return gave the condition as B." That was so for the 1st to the 10th of that month. The North Carolina average is half a bale to the acre. That is not a good yield for this State. It is said that 12 bales to an acre will produce a bale to the acre. Stocks Continue Strong and Advancing. Grain is Weaker. Cotton Being Controlled in Favor of Buyers. Will Sell Higher.

NEW YORK, September 11.-The Stock market continues strong with railway earnings increasing and extra dividend feature.

Cereals were weak on realizing on the crop report. The Government crop report on cotton yesterday was interpreted as bullish and the market advanced ten points. Liverpool cables this morning were disappointing and their failure to respond to yesterday's advance, caused disgust and buyers sold out. No called his European correspondent last night that the Government had figured wrong and a ten million bale cotton crop was assured.

This was effective. Conservative people believe that Liverpool is manipulated to influence the market. This would not be surprising as consumers are desirous of selling cotton as cheap as possible.

Foreigners bought the advance in stock and grain same way but finally led to submit. This will be true of cotton. The demand is increasing, and statistics the position is strong and will cause legitimate buying sooner or later.
