REPORT DUE TO-DAY

At Washington - Efforts in Spain May bring Trouble. Movements of Warships, Old Monitors to be Placed in Service. Senators Make Speeches.

WASHINGTON, March 21. The program of the Administration for the settlement of the Cuban question is reported as follows:

First, Senator Gallinger spoke in the Senate today giving his personal observations on the situation.

Second, Senator Thurston will give his views on the situation in the island tomorrow.

Third, the other reports of the United States Navy, including the report of the Spanish fleet, will be presented at a meeting of the Senate tomorrow.

Fourth, the President will deliver a message to Congress in the afternoon of the 22nd, in which he will outline his policy in regard to the Cuban question.

WASHINGTON LATEST.

Senate Decided Not to Adjourn As First Voted.

Senator Thurston Speaks in Strong Terms. Body of Lieut Jenkins Found. Admiral Sigsbee Relieved. Sampson Succeeds to the Command.

WASHINGTON, March 21. The Senate voted to reconsider the vote on adjournment Monday. Both Houses decided that there was need of haste for making naval appropriations.

Secretary Day thinks that intervention is now the only solution of the Cuban question.

WASHINGTON, March 21. The greatest pressure is being brought upon President McKinley by both the financial and the Cuban interests, making this the most trying moments in his life.

The President was in conference with Secretary Day until two o'clock this morning. He was at eight o'clock and was seen after visited by Senator Hanna.

The President and Secretary Long will await the arrival of the report of the general inquiry of the Maine disaster which will arrive about midnight tonight. Every effort is being made by the railway authorities not to allow any delay to the train carrying Lieut. Commander Mary and the report.

The controversy of the leaders of the Senate and House, which has been of long continuation for the past few days, is not so much for the purpose of gaining the settlement of the two Houses upon the Cuban situation, as to prevent a bill being introduced which would take the Maine away from the hands of the Navy Department.

A prominent Senator, referring to the night's White House conference, said before his colleagues the surprising information that he had good reason to believe that the court of inquiry would submit evidence in the report showing that Spain was necessary to the explosion.

The Navy Department has received information that the Spanish torpedo fleet, which has been ordered to the Canaries, for several days, started westward this morning.

Captain Sigsbee and six other officers of the Maine were today detached from command and ordered home on waiting orders.

The Senate has adjourned until Monday by request of the President.
