OUR MEN TO PORTO RICO.

Two North Carolina Regiments to Go to The Island NEARING THE END.

Almost Certain That Spain Is Accepting Terms. Small Details Remain. Fever in Cuba. General Miles Nearing San Juan to Begin Siege.

Special to Journal. Washington, August 3. The First North Carolina Regiment is ordered into the 2nd Brigade. The North Carolina officers of the 2nd Regiment are to report by telegraph to General Wade at Washington for instructions. Both the three North Carolina Regiments are to go to Porto Rico. The army corps of General Fozburgh is to go to Cuba within a week.

Porto Rico. Nine more towns in Porto Rico have surrendered and two thousand Spanish volunteers have laid down their arms to General Miles.

Saturday the American army will be close upon San Juan and the siege of the town will have commenced.

Fever at Santiago. The total number of yellow fever cases at Santiago is 5,179. Of these the new cases are 489. The number of cases reported as recovered is 4,639.

Progress of Peace. Spain has submitted an answer to President McKinley through Ambassador Cambon and it is considered as accepting the terms but as requiring over \$200,000,000. Further instructions were asked for.

The answer through Ambassador Cambon was received in a long dispatch which was Spain's reply to the President's note regarding the terms on which the United States is willing to begin peace negotiations.

From Madrid it is announced that Spain had accepted the terms proposed by the United States. These reports were generally credited by the administration officials, who are now carefully examining for the confirmation.

Returning to Havana.

Washington, Aug. 2. A reduction of the fleet of regular warships and auxiliaries impressed from the merchant service has been decided upon by the naval officials and will be put partly into effect at once. This will be followed immediately after the surrender of San Juan and the capture of Porto Rico by the detachment of many of the powerful fighters from service in the South, with orders to proceed home for repairs.

The four big American liners will be the first ships affected, two, probably the St. Paul and St. Louis, being turned over to the army for use as transports and the other two, the Yale and Harvard, sent to navy yards and put in readiness for trans-Atlantic commerce.

The second district shall be composed of the following counties: Hertford, Bertie, Martin, Washington, Tyrrell, Edgecombe, Halifax, Northampton, Beaufort, Nash and Pitt.

Third district: Craven, Greene, Lenoir, Jones, Pamlico, Carteret, Wayne and Onslow.

Fourth district: New Hanover, Henderson, Brunswick, Columbus, Bladen, Robeson, Sampson, Duplin, Cumberland and Richmond.

Fifth district: Wake, Chatham, Johnston, Harnett, Wilson, Durham, Person, Granville, Franklin, Vance, Warren and Moore.

Matters in bankruptcy filed in the several district courts in the Eastern district of North Carolina, shall be referred as provided by said act to the referee most convenient for all the interests of the estate and the creditors, railroad companies, water carriers and other matters being duly considered. Clerks and deputy clerks will until referees are appointed immediately inform the judges of the district of any petitions in bankruptcy which may be filed in their several courts. Any petitioner in bankruptcy or creditor who may be dissatisfied with a referee may have the same changed or continued by a reference to the judge.
