TWENTY AMERICANS KILLED.

Hipinos Attack a Garrison. Thirty Men Hold a Church Five Days.

MANTUA, May 2.—The American garrison at Mantua, Island of Samar, consisting of 33 men, belonging to the Forty-third Regiment, has been attacked by rebels. Twenty of the Americans were killed. The remainder were saved.
