It is pointed out that a month has now claysed since anything was heard from the British legation in Pekin. If messages can go one way they ought obviously to go another, but unfortunately it has been found impossible, in this country at all events, to Induce the Chinese authorities to get any message through to the Foreign Ministers in Pekin or to transmit any intelligence from them to Eu-


